## **BEGIN ENGLISH AT YOUR LEVEL**

You will be placed at the English level that is right for you before entering a university program. You can take university-level courses at the same time based on your English level.



\*Can be University or High school courses \*\*Students must take a minimum of 3 courses to be considered full time

#### English Language Centre (ELC)

Columbia College English Language Centre (ELC) prepares students for their academic studies in a collaborative and supportive setting. Students in the ELC have full access to Student Services and college facilities.

The intensive full-time English for Academic Purposes (EAP) program runs for 25 hours a week, while general English as an Additional Language (EAL) students have the option to study full-time or part-time. Innovative teaching methods, current and research-based curriculum framework, e-learning tools, and experiential components are utilized in the lessons whenever possible.

Programs start 6 times per year with a minimum program length of 7 weeks. Once you progress beyond English 096, you can begin registering in university-level programs and advance further into university-level English.

STUDY, NORK, STAY.

> Full-time post-secondary students in Canada have the opportunity to combine their studies with valuable work experience on or off campus. If you meet the eligibility criteria, your study permit allows you to work up to 20 hours per week during regular academic sessions and full-time between semesters. Columbia College regularly posts job opportunities on campus. Associate degree holders from Columbia College qualify for the post graduate work permit in Canada and can take the advantage of staying and working in the country after graduation.

## ASSOCIATE DEGREE

#### **CHOOSE YOUR ROUTE**

After completion of an Associate Degree apply directly to a university or apply for a post graduate work permit.

An Associate Degree is equivalent to the first two years of a four-year university degree. With an Associate Degree, you can enter into the third year of a university's bachelor's degree program.

## POST-GRADUATE WORK PERMIT PROGRAM (PGWPP)

The PGWPP allows students who have graduated from Columbia College with an Associate Degree to gain valuable Canadian work experience. Skilled Canadian work experience gained through the PGWPP helps graduates qualify for permanent residence (PR) in Canada.

Students who enter university upon completion of PGWPP and PR will qualify for domestic tuition rates in Canada, drastically reducing the cost of a bachelor's degree program. A work permit under the PGWPP may be issued for 12 to 36 months depending on the length of your study program.

In order to apply for PGWPP, students must submit proof of graduation (certificate and final transcript) within 180 days of completion of studies. For more information, please visit:

## UNIVERSITY TRANSFER

British Columbia offers the smoothest college-to-university transfer system in Canada, which is overseen by the British Columbia Council on Admission and Transfer. In the BC transfer system, students can take up to 60 credits at first and second year level to transfer to Canadian universities. Over the years, Columbia College has been one of the top providers of international students to the University of British Columbia and Simon Fraser University. Advantages include small class sizes, meaning personal attention to each student and a closer relationship with instructors and classmates, and affordable tuition as prices per course are lower than in university.

## ENGINEERING AT COLUMBIA COLLEGE

Engineering requires a general first year at most Canadian institutions. All students choose from the following core courses and must complete a minimum of 24-27 credits before applying to their area and university of choice, such as UBC, SFU, and UVic. Students must meet the grade point average determined by their university of choice for admission. Intakes and deadlines vary by institution.
