Essential Technology and Workplace Skills Program

What is it?

The Essential Technology and Workplace Skills Program's primary purpose is to improve all learner's digital literacy and work-ready skills by providing accessible, up-to-date training modules. The program provides fundamental training in Microsoft Word, Excel, Powerpoint, as well as a Typing Essentials Program, to ensure students in all disciplines are equipped for full participation in academic programs as well as the future workforce.

Beginning in the 2021/2022 academic year students can also apply to participate in the College's LinkedIn Learning Circle and the 'New to...Series'. LinkedIn Learning Circles provide successful applicants with a free subscription and access to self-directed learning, career support, and workplace skills modules available on the LinkedIn Learning platform. The 'New to...Series' utilizes free, openly available resources created by industry leaders made accessible to students in semi-facilitated workshops. Examples include the New to Digital Citizenship series with Google, and the New to Graphic Design with Canva. All programs are directed towards students of all backgrounds (tech and non-tech).

Community Connections Program

Practical experience in the workplace provides an important step along the path to career success. For many newcomers it can be incredibly challenging to gain work experience in Canada aligned with their long term career goals.

What is it?

In this program, Columbia College will cover the employment costs for students to take on projects and provide support services to local community benefit organizations. The impact of funds invested in this program is twofold:

- Aspiring new Canadians get valuable work experience, and build relationships, with local organizations
- Local community benefit organizations get additional staff support at no cost

Experiential Learning Projects

Various students in different academic programs take on industry projects via the Riipen platform to equip them with work-ready skills. Riipen brings industry and academic together with real company projects. Students and faculty at the College are supported by a College

For who?

A select number of students are placed with local non-profit organizations every semester. Student eligibility comprises the following:

- Must be a current Columbia College student
- Eligible to work in Canada and must have a valid Social Insurance
 Number
- Good academic standing; not on Academic Probation
- Completed at least 24 credits as well as ENG 100
- Proficiency with Microsoft Office is considered an asset
- Previous experience working or volunteering with non-profit organizations is considered an asset
