

INTERNAL CLAIMANT BURSARY

Columbia College provides bursaries to students who have filed for refugee status or protected persons in Canada.

Students may qualify for all programs at Columbia College at a discounted tuition rate. Students must be 15-30 years old and must present a valid study permit until official Permanent Resident (PR) Card presented.

All applicants to submit a written statement describing: (i) why they wish to attend Columbia College, (ii) how they can make a positive contribution to college life.

Bursary students must demonstrate a willingness to commit to extra-curricular activities while studying at Columbia College. Students are expected to study full time (3 courses) and maintain a satisfactory GPA of 2.0 or higher.

1. Refugee Protection Claimant Document
2. Notice to Appear for Hearing (with scheduled date)
3. Notice of Decision and Notice of Seizure (once received)
4. Valid study permit (until official PR Card received)
5. PR card (once received)

Note: New International Tuition Deposit (24 credits) may not be used towards bursary
