Applicants for the Scholar Path Award will be evaluated by a Selection Committee using an Evaluation Rubric organized into the following categories, described on this page:

- **Academic**
- **Community Involvement**
- **Leadership Experience**

Each area is evaluated on a scale from 0 to 5.

Applicants are encouraged to provide as much detail as possible for each category to increase their chances of success.

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

The Community Involvement category will receive an evaluation score for each area below. A description of responses that would be scored a '5' is provided.

Degree and type of involvement:

Clearly describes specific projects they created, supported, or developed

How recent?

Demonstrates continued involvement in the community over time

Duration

On going involvement for over 2 years

Benefit to the Community:

Clear and demonstrated transformative impact on a pressing issue

Community References:

Provides specific contacts and a positive reference



LEADERSHIP

'Leadership experience' is defined as one or more of the following;

- A formal role leading a club, group, or organization
- Experience founding, growing, or expanding a club or group
- Courses or learning focused on Leadership Skills
- Experience growing or enhancing a program or project

ACADEMIC

The Academic category will receive an evaluation score for each area below. A description of responses that would be scored a '5' is provided.

Quality of Application:

Clear responses to the entire application that illustrate candidate eligibility and the impact of the award

Commitment to Chosen Field of Study:

Clear description showing how past studies and activities have led to deeper engagement in the candidate's chosen field of study

Foster Intellectual Growth:

Clear demonstration that the scholarship will foster deep, sustained, long term intellectual growth
