Scholar Path Program: For Students Transitioning from Columbia College to a Baccalaureate Program at a Canadian University

Objective:

The primary objective of the Scholar Path Program is to provide financial assistance to students and alumni who have successfully graduated from or are transferring from a program at Columbia College, and who have demonstrated exceptional academic performance, leadership potential, and commitment to their chosen field of study. By offering this scholarship, Columbia College aims to encourage and support these students in continuing their education at any Canadian University, fostering their intellectual growth, and enabling them to contribute meaningfully to society.

Eligibility Criteria:

To be eligible for this scholarship, Columbia College alumni must meet the following criteria:

- Have completed a minimum of 30 transfer credits at Columbia College.
- Be admitted into a Bachelor's degree program at a Canadian University.
- Be registered and enrolled as a full-time student in a Bachelor's degree program at a Canadian University. Enrollment of less than 9 credits will not be considered for this scholarship.
- Be seeking their first Bachelor's degree from a Canadian University.
- Be involved with community benefit programs, activities, or organizations; contributing to the wellbeing of local, provincial, or national communities.
- Not be a current employee of Columbia College.

Priority will be given to applicants who:

- Have graduated from (or completed their studies at) Columbia College within the last 2 years
- Have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0
 - Applicants with a lower GPA may be considered based on exceptional circumstances at the discretion of the College

Candidate Selection:

Applications will be evaluated by a Selection Committee based on an Evaluation Rubric. The Evaluation Rubric is posted on the College website. Applicants should review the rubric prior to submitting an application and are encouraged to provide details regarding each category in the rubric.

Each applicant has the opportunity for their draft application to be reviewed once by a member of the Scholar Path Committee at the College to provide support and feedback prior to final submission.

Scholarship Amount:

The scholarship amount under this program varies from \$10,000 - \$30,000, based on applicants' status in Canada (from the two categories below). This scholarship does not cover the entire cost of attendance and will only help with a portion of tuition and fees incurred by the recipient during their tenure at a university. Students are encouraged to seek other funding opportunities as well.

Domestic Tuition (Students with Canadian Citizenship or Permanent Residency, with Refugee Backgrounds/Protected Status or College Alumni with Gap Years):

International Tuition (University Transfer Applicants):

Total Amount: \$30,000
